



## Alberto Melloni

Alberto Melloni is professor of History of Christianity at University of Modena/Reggio Emilia, secretary of the Foundation for Religious Studies and Chair Holder of the UNESCO Chair on Religious Pluralism and Peace at the University of Bologna.

Previously he was senior lecturer at the University of Roma<sup>3</sup> and Visiting Fellow at Cornell University and Université Catholique de Fribourg. He is the founder of the European Academy of Religion and the La Pira Library in Palermo. He is also coordinator of Rei\_Res and Resilience, the research infrastructure on religious studies and he received Prin grants twice.

His publications focus on the history of Councils, on medieval canon law, on contemporary religious history. He was the coordinator of several international research projects - on Vatican II, on Constantine, on Luther, on don Lorenzo Milani and on John XXIII, and on the critical edition of the series COGD in the Corpus Christianorum.

He is on the board of several scientific Societies and Journals («Cristianesimo nella storia» Bologna, «Schweizerische Zeitschrift für Religions- und Kirchengeschichte» Fribourg, «Studia Historiae Ecclesiasticae» Pretoria, «Common Knowledge», Duke) and Member of the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei.

Columnist on newspaper and tv, he served three times as Advisor to the Italian Minister of Education, University and Research, and he is presently Advisor to the Minister of Education.
