

Why does dissemination matter?

- Dissemination is the transfer of research-based knowledge to the ones that can best make use of it
- It is an essential means of maximizing the impact of research
- Dissemination provides added value to research projects, as the impact of research can be potentially wider than the original focus
- It is an intrinsic element of all good research practice
- Knowledge generated from research projects has a tendency to stay where it is generated; dissemination prevents it becoming sticky and effectively lost
- Dissemination promotes the profile of the organisation and strengthens its research capacity



So than why not disseminate? or the barriers to effective dissemination

- Institutional priorities/organization culture
- Practical difficulties
- Technical and infrastructural barriers
- Anxiousness about critical peer review

Horizon 2020 Programme increased importance given to dissemination

- Focus on societal challenges facing EU society
- Included in the Commissioner's mandate:

'to focus on 'maximising the value added and impact of Horizon 2020, ensuring effective use and dissemination of project results. This should also support and enrich policy-making at national and EU level'



- Focus on the '3 Os' of Commissioner Moedas Open Science, Open Innovation and Open to the World
- Open Science key actions:
 - Advancing Open Access to publications and Open Access to data
 - The European Open Science Cloud
 - Text and Data Mining (Copyright)
 - Fostering Research Integrity
 - Making Science More Inclusive Citizen Science

Aim: increase S&T excellence and impact through openness



Horizon 2020 Programme

increased importance given to dissemination

- Dissemination and Exploitation included in the weighing of the Impact criterion
- Rules for Participation putting a clear accent to the beneficiaries' obligations to exploit and disseminate the outcomes of the funded activities



Validation criteria for Horizon 2020

The D&E Plan needs to incorporate detailed exploitation and dissemination strategies, clearly defining how research results will be implemented and how they will impact on the market, on future developments and policy making.



Strategy for an effective dissemination and exploitation of Horizon 2020 research results

Strategic objective

To create the necessary conditions and establish the means to put research results to economic and societal use and make available scientific evidence in support of policy making.

Boundary conditions

Maintaining the existing legal framework

First and foremost responsibility for Dissemination and Exploitation lays with the project consortium The Commission services support and supplement the dissemination and exploitation activities

No additional burden on beneficiaries

Focus on dissemination and exploitations versus communication

Target outputs

Support beneficiaries in Dissemination and Exploitation

- Guidance on D&E for proposers and projects
- Feedback and assessment of D&E during project reviews
- D&E support services and activities



Provide efficient external access to project outputs

- Tools to search and access project data and results
- CORDIS dissemination activities
- Open Data Portal, OpenAire, Open Research data support



Facilitate internal use of project results for policies

- Internal tools to access all project data and results
- Recognition and flagging of relevant results -- e.g. Innovation Radar
- Modern T/D tools for project content and results exploration




Enhance internal culture and processes for D&E

H2020 Dissemination & Exploitation

How?

Dissemination: Make project results known to:

- ✓ Peers / users / public at large
- ✓ Industry / commercial operators
- ✓ Policy makers / stakeholders

Exploitation: Put project results to economic and societal use

YwoH

- ✓ Publications, conferences, ODP...
- ✓ Open access to publications, research data, public service information
- √ Feedback into policy making
- ✓ CORDIS, ICT-methodologies (e.g. visualisation of information and data)
- ✓ Involve users in projects
- ✓ Develop, create or market a product, process or service
- ✓ Commercialize IPR, encourage innovative spin-offs and start-ups
- ✓ H2020 Financial Instruments (e.g. use loans and venture capital)
- ✓ Support standardization, "proof of concept" and pre-commercial procurement
- ✓ Apply socio-economic research



H2020 Dissemination & Exploitation: who does what?

- > H2020 Beneficiaries are required to:
- Submit a draft plan for the dissemination and exploitation of the research results at proposal submission
- Carry out dissemination and exploitation activities during (and after) the project's completion
- Report online (always open) on dissemination and exploitation activities and progress against the plan
- Always acknowledge the financial support received from the Union when undertaking dissemination and exploitation activities



H2020 Dissemination & Exploitation: who does what?

- > H2020 project officers are required to:
- Ensure that the project monitoring includes a focus on D&E from day one and that the implementation of D&E plan is regularly reviewed
- Review, assess and, if satisfied, approve progress on dissemination and exploitation activities
- Highlight/flag projects with high exploitation and/or dissemination potential
- Provide the necessary support, guidance and D&E support services to projects



Guidance for project coordinators

Why, when and to whom should the projects disseminate?

- Impact, uptake, exploitation
 - effectively disseminated in a targeted manner, to the stakeholders who can make best use of the outcomes of the research
 - > identify the potential end-users of the expected results
- Planned from the start of the project & continuous activity throughout the lifetime of the project and <u>after</u> the project has ended
- Share and use knowledge at an earlier stage in the research process and across complementary research fields, at European level
- Concentrate on the demand side aspects of knowledge circulation
 - making sure that scientific work and results are openly available to those who can make best use of them, as early as possible and in an easily accessible, understandable and re-usable form
- Policy-relevant results should be identified and brought to the attention of the appropriate bodies at international, Union, national and regional level.





Guidance for project coordinators

writing effective publishable summaries

- Publishable summaries are suitable for direct publication and should not contain any confidential data.
- Publishable Summaries are written in English and are clear, concise and understandable, with a proper syntax and grammar.
- Publishable Summaries are easily understandable by potential partners, researchers, policy makers, commercial parties and others interested in the results of research.
- Publishable Summaries focus on the following:
 - Innovation
 - Possible implementation of results, be it on commercial markets or in public policies
 - Dissemination of the results
