#### **EUROPEAN RESEARCH & INNOVATION DAYS**





- A working group with representatives from Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Norway, Poland and Sweden jointly designed and implemented citizen codesign activities to provide inputs to the Mission
- Three actions: 1) physical co-design sessions with stakeholders as proxies for citizens (FI, SE); 2) virtual co-design sessions with citizens (EE, FI, NO, PL, SE); 3) digital surveys (DK, EE, FI, NO, PL, SE).
- Over 1100 citizens involved, over a 6 month period across the region

Commission



- Significant emphasis on restorative practices for biodiversity ecosystem regeneration, demonstrating an understanding and prioritisation of the systemic interdependencies between human and nonhuman wellbeing.
- A clear interest in tourism and leisure, which provides a platform to drive that restoration, which in turn necessitates change in polluting sectors like industry and agriculture towards regenerative and circular, as well as in landuse planning and other related policymaking and governance.
- Citizens also demonstrate clear interest in energy generation, food production, carbon capture as system interactions, alongside other sustainable and health-related dynamics.
- There is clear evidence that citizens want to be involved in driving this change, not simply expressing a preference for change. This provides an open invitation for reorienting policymaking around people and place (or human and nonhuman forms of life), as well as prioritising new collaboration/participation models for regeneration, co-ownership, mission design and delivery, ocean literacy, and so on.
